



Position overview

Erskine Theological Seminary is seeking two devoutly Reformed Christian (must be active members of a NAPARC church) doctorally-trained, licensed Counsellors who can teach and work in a small counseling practice. These two new tenure-track positions will assist in launching a new CACREP-accredited Master of Arts in Christian Counseling. This 60-hour degree will include 18-hours of traditional seminary courses and 42-hours of State-mandated licensure courses. This exciting opportunity will allow the faculty hired to leave lasting impressions on the program and students to help heal a broken and hurting world. This is a teaching practitioner model, requiring excellence in counseling and counseling skills, a heart for God, and a willingness to develop into an excellent teacher. While research is encouraged, it is not what you are evaluated on for tenure and promotion. These positions will require some travel between sites in Due West, SC and either Greenville or Columbia, with opportunities for other sites in Charleston and Charlotte. Only Due West is mandatory for weekly presence teaching, with another primary site for counseling education.

Minimum Qualifications

Applicants must have an earned doctoral degree in Counseling (LPC-S) or Counselor Education and Supervision (CES) from a CACREP or APA accredited institution. Applicants who have completed all requirements except the dissertation (ABD) may be considered if already licensed as LPC-S or equivalent. ABD candidates must have their doctoral degrees conferred by the time of hire. Evidence of potential for scholarly research. A history of increasing quality of teaching is needed, as is the ability to teach key courses in counseling, such as: general, employment, addictions, and trauma. Evidence of active church participation in a traditionally Reformed church and ability to sign the Erskine Statement of Faith are essential.

Applicants for employment at Erskine Theological Seminary must have read and affirm in their entirety the following documents: 1) The Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church's <u>Definition of an Evangelical Christian</u>, 2) The Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church's <u>Philosophy of Christian Higher Education</u>, and 3) The <u>Statement on Human Sexuality</u>, adopted by the Erskine Board of Trustees in 2015.

Experience counseling college students or military veterans; previous experience as a full-time faculty member in a counselor education program for a minimum of one full academic year.
